COUNSELLOTZ'S COTENETZ

Did you know our brain is like a Tootsie Pop? It was so much fun teaching the grade 4's that we can think of the hard crunchy part of the Tootsie Pop as the <u>cortex</u> part of the brain. This is the part of the brain we use to <u>process information</u>, <u>problem solve</u>, <u>plan</u>, <u>create</u>, <u>and cooperate with others</u>. The stick of the Tootsie Pop can be compared to the <u>brain stem</u>. It is a <u>reactive</u> part of the brain - <u>it is not rational</u>. It resists change and is closed to new ideas. The <u>limbic system</u> (the soft middle part of the Tootsie Pop) is like a 'gateway' to both the cortex



and the brain stem. The limbic system is the 'emotion centre' of the brain. When the limbic system senses positive emotion such as love, joy, excitement, high interest, enthusiasm, it opens the 'gateway' to the cortex. When the limbic system senses negative emotions such as stress, fear, anger, depression or resistance, it closes the 'gateway' to the cortex, and downshifts the brain stem part of the brain.

However, as we mature, we can learn to recognize negative feelings in ourselves more quickly, and CHOOSE to access the cortex part of our brain - to think about how we want to respond instead of react.

Understanding how the brain works can help us learn self control. It can also help us understand that how we talk to children can completely affect which part of their brain they will automatically access, which controls how they respond.

To be eligible for Kindergarten children must be 5 years of age on or before December 31, 2016.

Pick-up & Drop-off Locations 8:00am - 4:30pm

To ensure the safety of our students and due to the congestion of our staff parking lots and bus loop areas, parents are asked not to enter those areas between 8:00-4:30. If you are dropping off or picking up your child, please park on the street or on the church yard across from the school.

For the safety of your child, we request that <u>you escort</u> your child across Henry Street, Barkman Street and Penner Street.

Arrival/Leaving Time

Walking students and those dropped off by parents should arrive at school after 8:30 in the morning. Teacher supervision is provided starting at 8:30. Any students arriving on the playground before 8:30 will not be supervised and responsibility for the student belongs with the parent/guardian. Students are permitted to enter the building when the 8:53 bell rings. Students are required to leave for home by 4:00 in the afternoon unless prior arrangements have been made.



SAFETY FIRST

At times, parents or designated others pick up their children during the school day. Most homeroom teachers recognize the parents but at times we have guest teachers or the children are in Music or Phys. Ed. It is virtually impossible for these teachers to recognize all the parents or the designated "picker-uppers". So in order to provide a safer environment, parents are asked to report to the office to sign out their children. The secretary will be happy to call your child(ren) to the office for you. If she is unfamiliar with you she can check our files to ensure your child is being picked up by the correct person. Please work with us as we continue to implement this method and bear with us when we ask you to check with the office if you forget and show up at the classroom door.

As a school safety is of utmost concern to us. We have security cameras in various locations on the premise, both inside and outside. We have an extensive crisis plan in place and a crisis team who reviews the plan on a continual basis. We practice lock downs twice per school year in order to prepare our staff and students for a real crisis should it ever happen. All of our staff are trained to be on alert for anything or anyone suspicious and report it to the Principal immediately.

It is the time of year again when many students become ill with a cold or flu. Please call the school between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 if your child will be absent from school for any reason.


A phone call is also necessary if your child will be late. Late students are to check in at the office before heading to class.
